A Plymouth + Community Outdoor Art Exhibit

Home Ice 2022 -



Inspired by the Plymouth Ice Festival that begins next week, the PCAC is inviting area artists and families to create a community-wide **Art Ice Exhibit** - set up in your own yard, on your apartment patio block or in the neighborhood common space. Organize friends and create giant colorful cubes in plastic or foil-pan containers and arrange them in a tower, creative ice "garden" or a more "formal" outdoor exhibit on snowball pedestals - we will have ours on display at the PCAC along Sheldon Road.

#### How to get started!

This is an Overnight(or 2 night) Indoor/Outdoor Project Requiring below freezing temperatures - perfect for Michigan artists. Simply put, you will be freezing nature-friendly stuff in colored (or not!) water. Check out last year's exhibit on our Plymouth Community Arts Council facebook page.

#### Materials

- \* Foil pans or Plastic containers (empty and clean, foil pie or lasagna pans, plastic bowls, sherbet containers, plastic "shoe" storage boxes, to-go containers from the recycle bin?)
- \* Water in pitcher (s)
- \* Cold weather and flat outdoor spot to freeze your Art Ice

\*Suggestions for freezables: Sliced or shredded carrots, small pine cones, sliced citrus fruit, apple peels, raisins, colored tissue paper, dried flowers or fresh petals, single leaves, bird seed, unwrapped hard candies or lifesavers (holiday leftovers?). Tip - do not use too many freezables in a single art ice cube as the water needs to surround it all to make everything stay together when frozen.

\*Water can be left clear, or use a few drops of food coloring, jello powder or drink mix (gatorade, koolaid, lemonade, tea - even those not-so-fresh packets left over from last summer, or the tea that no one likes:)

HOW TO! Indoors: Gather your freezables and arrange them in the containers. Think about your color palette! Fill pitchers with water. You can color ahead of time, or add color outside. Outdoors: Place containers on a flat surface - they will be here overnight, so the front sidewalk is probably not a great spot! Pour water into containers at least 2 inches deep, but thicker is better especially with large containers like a foil lasagna size pan! Use a stick or fork to adjust placement of the objects in the pan. Sprinkle drink or jello powder over top, or add a few drops of food coloring and gently stir. Leave overnight (or 2 nights depending on how big your container is!) to freeze.

DISPLAY! Clear a snowy area to display your big ice. OR make LOTS of ice and arrange or stack them. OR make a snow pedestal and put your ice on top. Definitely take pics and post them on the PCAC's facebook page, email to lisa@plymoutharts.com or tag us on Instagram #pcacplymouth to be part of the online gallery.
