

The Plymouth DDA is proud to once again partner with the Salvation Army Plymouth Corp to kick off the holiday festivities in Downtown Plymouth with *The Main Street Boulevard Tree Lighting and Salvation Army Red Kettle Kick Off* on November 15 at 6:30 PM in Kellogg Park next to Main Street.

Prior to this event, the DDA conducts annual maintenance on the tree lights that are lit nightly year round. The lights, refreshed for the coming year, will be revealed at the event as the Salvation Army kicks off their season of giving. Visitors that donate non-perishable food items or a new children's toy will be entered to win gift cards, generously donated by Downtown Plymouth merchants. Enjoy free cookies, free hot chocolate thanks to E.G. Nick's and Gordon Foods, live holiday music brought to you by Sun & Snow, and a special Detroit Lions memorabilia raffle by CFCU.

Friends of the Penn receives grant from the Margaret Dunning Foundation

Friends of the Penn has received a grant of \$8,000 from the Margaret Dunning Foundation to support installation of a permanent public address system at the Penn Theatre.

The Penn Theatre was built in 1941 exclusively as a movie theatre. Last year, the Margaret Dunning Foundation provided funding for the installation of house lighting. This much needed upgrade allowed Friends of the Penn to make the space more adaptable for an increasing number of non-film-based events. The additional of a permanent PA system will allow for better communication during events.

Ellen Elliott, executive director of Friends of the Penn says, "We host a mental health lecture series for the Plymouth-Canton Community School District that benefits our youngest citizens. We also collaborate with the Plymouth District Library to schedule author lectures for people of all ages. We work with other non-profit organizations, including Plymouth Pollinators, Keep Plymouth Leafy, Friends of the Rouge, and Plymouth Community Arts Council, to schedule programming that educates and inspires our residents. This project will also help us better communicate with our audience during movie events that involve post-screening discussion. We are grateful to the Margaret Dunning Foundation for their assistance in helping us continue with our charitable mission of preserving and maintaining the historic Penn Theatre."






The DDA Mission
